




St. André Bessette was beatified (made Blessed) on May 23, 1982, in St. Peter's Square in Rome by Pope John Paul II. He was canonized a Saint on October 17, 2010, in St. Peter's Square in Rome by Pope Benedict XVI. St. André Bessette was the name chosen to be our Patron in 2020 when our three Churches became a new Parish. There are likely many reasons for choosing St. André Bessette — Canadian Saint; one who offered hospitality and acted as a conduit of God's love, healing, and mercy; a Religious of the Holy Cross in Montreal; are but among a few. I invite each of us as members of the Parish of St. André Bessette to spend some time reflecting on St. André Bessette, his life, his character, his faith. Share in your own Domestic Church and assist your children and grandchildren to grow in an understanding of what makes a saint a saint. Let's become familiar with the Patron of our Parish. Interestingly enough, we also have a couple more saints in our Parish to reflect upon as well – St. Bernard of Clairvaux and St. Rose of Lima – two of our churches in our Parish continue to retain their Saint names. It also provides a morning respite for caregivers. The program consists of a variety of social activities and fun, gentle exercises and special events, all run by volunteers. They meet Monday from 9:30 am to noon, from September to the end of June. A suggested donation of \$5 a week is put toward supplies.
