

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER APRIL 23, 2023

Our journey through the Easter Season has brought us readings from the Acts of the Apostles — the reality of the early, first beginnings of the Church. There was indeed a boldness on behalf of the Apostles who were continuing the Mission of Jesus Christ in the midst of a world that continued to question and reject the message Jesus came to bring. Nonetheless, the Apostles carried on with even deeper conviction. Today, in our Church in the world, we have become rather complacent or maybe better still, allow the world to change our Church because we continue to hear the mantra – "You guys are in the dark ages." "You don't still hold to those teachings which are antiquated?" "What is truth?" We have been made to feel guilty because some individuals want what they want and will not bend to receive what God wants to give them. The Gospel story is another example of not being able to recognize Jesus until we actually take time to heed his message – What is he teaching? What is he saying? Why does he even care? etc... Our Mission to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ in his name has not changed. Our Mission is the proclamation of his word, of Jesus' teaching through which we are transformed and changed – transformed in the image and likeness of God who created us and loved us first. The world still continues to want to muzzle or even silence the proclamation of the Gospel. Some Churches have even gone so far as to rewrite the Gospel, or modify it in such way that it nullifies or falsifies its authority and power. Today, may we experience, just as those who were on the road to Emmaus, what they experienced. "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the Scriptures to us?" ...Fr. Gerald

Messages from Father Gerald

Parish Logo and Parish Mission Statement — The Pastoral Council met last Tuesday evening and most of our conversation and deliberation involved the choosing of a logo for our Parish. Along with that, deeper conversation had to do with our Mission Statement for the Parish. Once again, I want to thank Tanya White for leading us through the Branding exercise, in which we will continue to be engaged as we formulate our Mission Statement, and Krystal Kristiansen in modifying our logo. We hope to be able to share that with you all sometime soon.

Parish/Church Signage — As we have received a new name for our Parish, St. André Bessette - which is inclusive of what was formerly two parish church and one Mission church – there is an interest in changing the present signage at two of our Church locations with an electronic sign. I want to thank Hal Benson and the people who worked on the committee for taking the lead on that work with St. Bernard. Also, thanks for sharing and communicating with St. Rose of Lima so similar work can be accomplished and preparation for the electronic sign be made ready. Within the next short while we will see the work begin at St. Bernard and soon at St. Rose of Lima. The electronic signage will allow us to place current events and various updates and invitations to the people of Enfield and Fall River areas, and to whomever takes an interest when driving by. With Holy Cross Church in Middle Musquodoboit, we will try to modify the signage to have the name St. André Bessette Parish added.

Archbishop Dunn's Visit to St. André Bessette Parish — There were a number of points that Archbishop Dunn shared with me as a result of his visit to St. André Bessette on the weekend of March 4 and 5. Overall, the Archbishop was very pleased with the sharing from the various active Committees, Councils and Organizations of our Parish. I will share the his remarks/comments with the groups addressed. He did ask that we strive to have a consistent flow with postures in the liturgy. Kneeling at the epiclesis (when the priest places his hands over the gifts on the Altar – just prior to consecration). The servers will ring the sanctuary bells at the time appropriate to kneel and I will pause to allow people time to kneel before continuing with the words of consecration. Each Eucharistic Prayer has a different time when the Epiclesis happens, so your indication to kneel will be when the servers ring the bells. If people are unable to kneel, I would ask that you be seated. The other posture is after coming back from receiving Communion. Remain standing until the Eucharist is placed back in the Tabernacle. Following this you may be seated or kneel taking a time for a prayer of thanksgiving for receiving Jesus' Body & Blood.
